PARENT INFORMATION

Early Leave Request Procedure

There are occasions when you may need to collect your young person early from school to attend an appointment. To request an early leave for your young person, please follow the procedure below:

Students requesting early leave must provide an essential reason for their leave in writing signed and dated by their parents/carer to student services before 9:00am. Parents may email the school email account prior to 9:00am on the day of the appointment. Leave requests emailed to the school during the day will not be approved unless an extraordinary circumstance exists. This will require approval from a member of the senior executive.

Justified leave will only be approved for essential reasons such as a medical appointment.

Evidence of the appointment should be provided to the school enabling the Principal to approve the early leave as justified.

Early leave requests without evidence of an appointment will be recorded as unjustified in accordance with **DoE Attendance Policy**.

It is expected that a parent/carer will pick up their young person to attend such an essential appointment. Parents/carers should not request students walk home unless there are extenuating circumstances approved by a member of the Senior Executive.

We request parents/carers do not call the office to request early leave or present to the school to pick up students without notice. This practice is causing significant issues for office staff who need to attend to student and school needs.

Unjustified early leaver requests will impact student attendance records. Like any attendance concern, repeated early leave requests will be followed up using appropriate measures, including a learning support meeting and possible Home School Liaison Officer involvement.

Unjustified absences will be recorded on student reports per the DoE Assessment and Reporting Policy.

Participation in sport is a mandatory requirement of the 7-10 school curriculum. Students with an injury or valid reason not to participate in sport should provide a letter to their Deputy Principal. We will provide these students with a non-sport option.

If your child is experiencing issues with attendance, please get in touch with Mr Ben O'Leary, Deputy Principal Attendance, so we can actively work together to resolve any concerns and avoid the impact of unjustified absences on your young person's attendance record.

Last week in Agriculture, a small group of classes had the opportunity to learn about fibre processing in Agriculture.

Vicki Cornish, an expert in fibre arts, came to explain to students how people have traditionally taken animal and plant fibres such sheep and alpaca wool, silk, and flax and spun them into yarn using tools such as a spindle, hand carding, and distaff.

This was a tactile experience for students as they felt the difference between fine and course wools and fibres with various oils and other properties.

While these traditional methods are rare today, it was a good opportunity for cross curriculum learning and to help students understand the physical attributes of primary products studied in Agriculture such as wool.

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Mind Reading Numeracy



Maths magic tricks are an underused slice of maths life yet they are an inventive, enjoyable and fascinating way of bringing numbers to life. They have the power to motivate, inspire and amaze children, as well as, help children to understand maths concepts and develop their maths skills. Maths is used in heaps of different places around the world. Use this mind reading Mathematics trick to amaze your friends and family. Follow this step-by-step guide to complete the trick.

- 1. Have your spectator pick any card without showing you.
- 2. Tell them to double its value in their head (Aces are worth 1 and Jacks, Queens and Kings are worth 10).
- 3. Add 3.
- 4. Multiply by 5.
- 5. Then add 1 to this new number if it's a Club, 2 if it's a Heart, 3 for Spades and 4 for Diamonds (if you have trouble remembering this order, just think of the word CHaSeD—Clubs, Hearts, Spades, Diamonds).
- 6. Have them give you the final total.
- 7. In your head, subtract 15. The first digit of your new number represents the value of their card and the second digit is the playing card suit. So, for example, 28 15 = 13. The first digit (1) represents Ace and the second digit (3) means their card is a Spade. They chose the Ace of Spades.

Great for addition, multiplication and subtraction practice for both the magician and participant.

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Information from the TAS Faculty



The TAS Faculty would like to remind parents/caregivers, of the correct footwear requirements for students to be able to participate in practical lessons.

The required footwear is black enclosed shoes, which must be worn as a safety requirement for all practical subjects.

Safe footwear is a WHS requirement for many school activities. The following is an extract from a Department of Education instruction concerning footwear and safety in practical work.

"Thongs, open type sandals or shoes, canvas type shoes and/or gym boots, shall not be worn in practical classes where there is a possibility of injury through spillage of hot liquids, metals, or the dropping of heavy or sharp instruments, tools etc."

While it is not possible to specify any one standard shoe to meet all situations, fully enclosed shoes with a stout sole, and firm leather uppers with a leather tongue are considered necessary.

The co-operation of parents/caregivers is requested in ensuring that their children wear the correct footwear. For girls, the ballet type slip-on shoe is not acceptable. Students who wear thongs or ugg boots will be sent home.

ACCEPTABLE STYLES – The shoes shown below **ARE** suitable and meet WHS requirements because:

- They have leather uppers
- There are NO punched holes or mesh
- They are NOT canvas
- They cover the upper part of the foot



A student is NOT allowed to participate in practical lessons if they are wearing footwear that does not meet WHS guidelines

<u>UNACCEPTABLE STYLES</u> – The styles shown below, and styles similar to these, **ARE NOT** acceptable in practical lessons. A practical lesson is any lesson where explicit safety rules apply. For example: Woodwork, Metalwork, Food Technology, Hospitality, Science etc.

The styles shown below ARE NOT WHS compliant.






