## VACCINATION PROGRAM 2016 AT RTHS

### Vaccines to be offered in 2016

#### ALL Year 7 Students:

- Varicella vaccine (chicken pox) as **a single dose** - for any student who has not had the disease
- Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough) (dTpa) adult vaccine – as **a single dose** to all year 7 students who have not received a recent adult dose.
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine – in a **3-dose schedule with 2 month gap between doses 1 & 2 and a 4 month gap between doses 2 & 3.**

### CONSENT FORMS

**Year 7 – a single consent form with opportunity to consent for all three vaccines on the one form. It is a new consent form with a fancy photo on the envelope.**

Even if students say they do not require a vaccine, we still ask that every eligible student take them home for their parents to read the information inside and decide if they wish to go ahead with vaccination or not.

### Vaccination Clinic bookings for 2016

You will shortly be or have already, been, contacted by your local school program staff for clinic bookings for 2016 and any change of details for your school. The preferred arrangements will be as follows although some school team leaders have other preferences, all of which meet the requirements of the program.

2	Wednesday 9 <sup>th</sup> March 2016	<b>to all Yr 7 students:</b> Varicella (single dose) Dose 2 HPV (Gardasil)
3	Wednesday 14 <sup>th</sup> September 2016	<b>to all Yr 7 students:</b> Dose 3 HPV (Gardasil)

Please note that minimum gaps must be observed between multiple dose vaccine courses. Please contact your local community health contact to discuss appropriate dates.

HPV (Gardasil)	56 days	112 days

**Year 8 students** who missed any vaccinations last year will be called up on these dates to complete their vaccination program. These students will be notified prior to visit 1 to ensure that they are present.

### Term 1

Already this term the following programs or initiatives have been scheduled:

**Every Tuesday Period 1** – Year 7 Peer Support run by Year 11 Peer Support leaders.

**Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> March** – Year 7 Peer Support excursion to Walka Water Works.

**Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March** – school based activities to promote the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence.

**Shine Program** – promoting personal and life skills for targeted Year 9 girls.

**PBL lessons** – timetabled fortnightly for all students in Year 7. These lessons are taught by the Year 7 Adviser Mr. Kegan Daly.

**Plan-it Youth** – a mentoring program for targeted Year 10 students held during Period 1 and 2 each Wednesday morning.

### **Peer Support**

During Term 4 last year a significant number of Year 10 students took part in a 2 day Peer Support Leadership training program. Many of these students went on to become Peer Support leaders and very effectively demonstrated their leadership skills by running two Peer Support sessions on the Year 6 Orientation Day last December. Peer Support will run at Rutherford High during Term 1 to assist our Year 7 students with transitioning to high school. The program will run for a series of 8 sessions which will be held during Period 1 each Tuesday. Year 7 students will meet with their Peer Support leaders each week and work through a range of activities which will all have a focus on 'Rethinking Challenges', with the aim of building and strengthening resilience.

This program will focus on the following skills:

- Perseverance
- Critical thinking
- Optimism
- Communication
- Empathy

This program also reinforces the schools PBL core values of respect, responsibility and commitment.

### **How can parents support the Peer Support program?**

Each week you can discuss with your child the activities, concepts and understandings they developed by participating in the Peer Support program. This will help to develop a positive connection between school and home. If you would like more information about the program, please contact the school.

### **Student Health Care: A reminder to parents to notify the school about your child's health**

We welcome information from parents about your child's health, even if you are not requesting specific support from our school. Our school asks for medical information when you enrol your child. It is also important that you let us know if your child's health care needs change or if a new health condition develops.

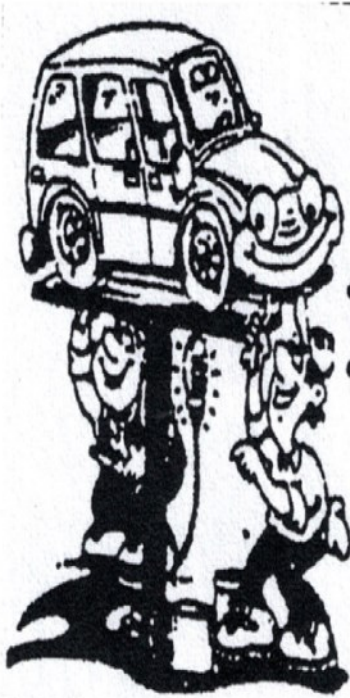
