SENIOR EXECUTIVE REPORT

Congratulations also to the many students who have represented our school this term in various sporting teams. Thanks to staff who have given up their time to coach these teams and also parents who have supported our students by transporting them to venues across the Hunter.

CHANGE TO TERM 2 STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY

RTHS is holding a joint SDD with MHS in Term 2, 2016. The availability of the presenter has made it necessary to change the scheduled date of the term 2 SDD. The first day back to school in Term 2 will be normal lessons for all students.

UPGRADE

ROAD SAFETY

Every week, on average we receive a phone call regarding a near accident on the roads around the school particularly the large roundabout in Alexander Ave. Students from the school have run out in front of traffic, ridden bikes in a dangerous manner, even disobeyed staff on duty and crossed in front of buses. Whilst we remind students about the danger of these actions, the phone calls continue and I suspect that there are many "near misses" of which we are unaware. It would be greatly appreciated if you would continue to discuss issues regarding road safety with your children.

ASSESSMENT SCHEDULES

Students and parents are reminded to regularly view the assessment schedule booklet students were issued with early Term 1 to ensure preparation for assignments and tests. This is particularly important for senior students.

UNIFORM

Rutherford Technology High school is proud of our uniform as it represents the standard and quality of education provided. Correct uniform must be worn every day, this includes jumpers and long pants. Please note, black jumpers, tights and jeans are not part of our uniform. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the survey to help improve how to do things in school. We look forward to viewing the results to determine change in teaching practice across the school.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

The new school year has been a busy and fruitful time for the VET Faculty at RTHS. We have welcomed Mrs Gillian Anderson aboard to assist with Careers and Transition activities and to teach Retail Services. Additionally, our faculty has gained the school's LOTE (Languages other than English) teachers (Mrs Sarah Thornton and Mrs Samone Ison) as part of our team. Due to our increase in numbers, we have taken ownership of the old HSIE staffroom and are in the process of making this an inviting place for students to visit to cater for their career, vocational education or language needs.

From a Vocational Education and Training (VET) perspective, we have had a very pleasing increase in numbers of students who have chosen to study a VET course. At RTHS, students may choose to study Business Services, Construction, Hospitality, Metals and Engineering, Primary Industries, Retail Services and Sports Coaching as part of their Higher School Certificate. On completion of each of these courses students receive a nationally recognised qualification, usually at Certificate II level. Overall, 47.49% of senior students at RTHS study a VET course. Our participation in this area has risen from 34.26% of students commencing a VET course in 2015 to 56.95% of students commencing a VET course in 2016. We have two Year 11 classes in Retail Services, Metal and Engineering and Construction and strong numbers in Business Services and Hospitality. Our Hospitality students also have the pleasure of learning in our newly established commercial kitchen.

Recently RTHS VET teachers have been praised for their professionalism and organisational skills in the recent Quality Assurance audit that has taken place. The regional Senior Pathways staff determined that teachers were delivering courses and keeping records to an extremely high level and meeting national industry standards. Well done to Mrs Anderson, Mr Brown, Mr Cromarty, Mrs McCallum, Mr Miller, Mr O'Leary, Mrs Smailes and Mrs Weber on their achievement. They have all demonstrated what exceptional teachers they are.

Senior RTHS students have also taken advantage of the opportunity to undertake school-based traineeships in Term 1. Students have the option of including SBATs as part of their Stage 6 pattern of study. This includes a minimum of 100 days of paid work and studying in a VET area over their Preliminary or HSC years. In 2015 RTHS experienced a 33% increase in students undertaking SBATs. Regionally (with the Tamworth RTO), RTHS has the second largest number of students undertaking School-Based Traineeships (15) and the largest in the Maitland area. In 2015, students at Rutherford Technology High undertook SBATs in the areas of Primary Industries (Equine), Metals and Engineering, Retail Services, Warehousing Operations and Community Services (Aged Care). 2016 has continued this trend with a number of students taking advantage of this option. 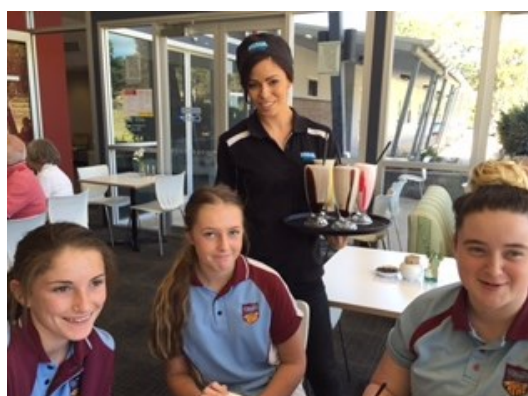
Police Liaison Officer Presentation

HELPFUL HINTS FROM THE LaST (LEARNING and SUPPORT TEAM)

In the last newsletter the first tool, **Getting Knowledge Ready**, explained how you can apply this strategy to improve literacy skills. The second tool that can help is focusing on unfamiliar words and meaning.



2. Vocabulary

What is it?

This is where you start to explore the text you are about to read by scanning the text and locating unfamiliar words. By doing this you can work out the meanings of words before reading. This helps you to get more meaning from the text and better understand what you are reading. Scanning the text may also help to trigger your prior knowledge and link new words with others you know.

What's in it for me?

This will help me to:

- Read words accurately
- Understand what I am reading
- Use what I know about some words to understand other words
- Better show what I know about the topic
- Learn more about the topic
- Link words I already know from previous topics to this one
- Have more words to express my ideas

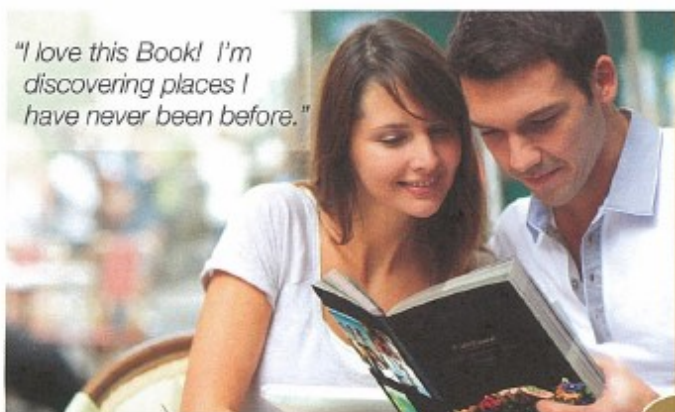

National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy 2016

LETTER TO PARENTS

In May 2016 the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools.

The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.

Student background information (student name, gender, date of birth, language background and Aboriginality) will be collected as part of the National Assessment Program. This information is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that every student's right to privacy is maintained.

The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 10-12 May 2016.

In the Numeracy tests students do not require any measuring tools such as rulers or protractors. In Years 7 and 9 there will be two Numeracy tests: one where a calculator is allowed and one where calculators are not to be used. For the calculator test, the student should use the calculator that they currently use at school.

Friday 13 May – A 'catch-up' day is scheduled for students who missed a test or were absent on a test day.

Students may be considered for exemption from the tests if they:

- are newly arrived in Australia (less than one year before the test) and with a language background other than English, or
- have significant intellectual disability and/or significant co-existing conditions which severely limit their capacity to participate in the tests.

All other students are expected to participate in the tests. Disability adjustments which reflect the student's normal level of support in the classroom may be provided. Large print, Braille, coloured paper versions and electronic tests are available to meet the needs of individual students.

Access to disability adjustments or exemption from the tests must be discussed with the school principal and a parent or carer consent form must be signed.

Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN by their parent or carer. This is a matter for consideration by parents in consultation with the school principal. If you wish to withdraw your child from the tests, a parent or carer consent form must be signed.

Please make an appointment with the principal of the school your child attends if you would like to discuss your child's participation in NAPLAN.

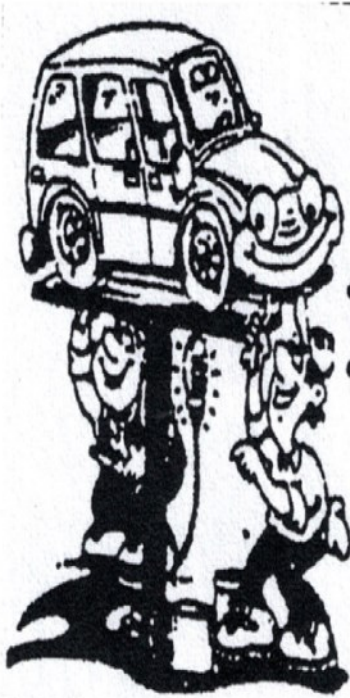
