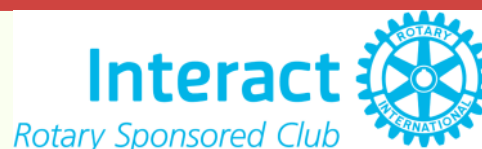

## NAPLAN 2016

As in previous years, our students have performed extremely well in the NAPLAN exams. The results have once again cemented Rutherford Technology High School as a great school.

Well done and congratulations to all of the students involved.

Your child's report will show his or her results in comparison with all other students from the same year group in Australia who sat the tests and will include:

- The national average
- The range for the middle 60 per cent of students
- Whether your child has achieved the national minimum standards



## **NAPLAN 2016**

An important feature of the national assessments is that your child's achievement in literacy and numeracy is now measured against common national assessment scales that continue from Year 3 through to Year 9. This means that as your child advances through school and has these assessments every second year, you will be able to monitor your child's progress in literacy and numeracy.

Another important feature of the report is how the achievement of the national minimum standard is shown. The old 'benchmark' report showed achievement of the national minimum standard as being above or below a single score. The new report shows the national minimum standard as a full band on the scale. For example, the national minimum standard for Year 7 is Band 5. If your child's result is in this band, then he or she has typically demonstrated the basic elements of literacy and numeracy needed to participate in school in Year 7. If your child's result is in the bottom band for the year level, he or she has not achieved the basic skills of literacy and numeracy for that year and needs focused intervention and additional support to help achieve the skills required to fully participate in schooling. ## **SCHOOL UNIFORM & SHOES**

It is great to see the vast majority of students wearing the correct school uniform.

As the end of the year approaches we will be advertising to all families the correct uniform requirements (including shoes) so that purchases can be made for 2017.

Black leather shoes are the only acceptable shoes (except for sport). These shoes have no markings (like the Nike Swoop etc) and are a plain black leather shoe.



When you enter a school and see students in the correct uniform it creates a very positive impression of the school. The school uniform is just like a uniform worn in the workplace. If you are working at McDonalds and you arrive for a shift in 'almost the right uniform' – you will be sent home. It is an important habit to develop. Students in Year 12 will receive their Assessment Task Booklets in the first week of Term 4 and it is a good idea for parents/carers to take a look too and familiarise themselves with the rules and regulations of the HSC. The HSC can be daunting for students and parents alike. Parents should spend some time with their child, learning about their subject choices and assessment task due dates. Start early..... too early? NEVER!

## **JUNIOR STUDENTS**

Term 4 is busy for our juniors and it is never too early to start studying for their Yearly Examinations. When students aren't in examinations they will be expected to be in class, business as usual. Help prepare your child for their exams by:

- working out a revision timetable for each subject
- break revision time into small chunks - hour-long sessions with short breaks
- make sure your child has all the essential books and materials
- buy new stationery, highlighters and pens to make revision more interesting
- go through school notes with your child or listen while they revise a topic

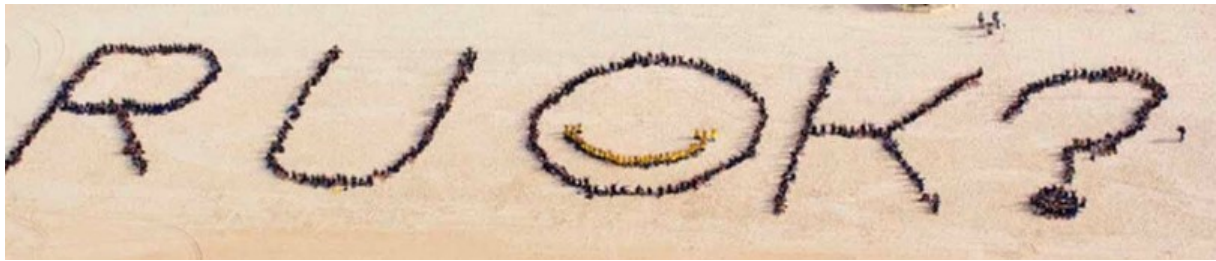
The price of success is hard work, dedication to the job at hand, and the determination that whether we win or lose, we have applied the best of ourselves to the task at hand.

 Read fluently  
 Concentrate well while reading  
 Willing to "risk" encountering difficult words and able to grapple with text ambiguities  
 Construct efficient strategies to monitor comprehension  
 Stop to use a "fix - it" strategy when confused  
 Reading skills improve

#### **After Reading**

Understand how the pieces of information fit together.  
 Able to identify what's salient  
 Interested in reading more





# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

## A REMINDER TO PARENTS TO NOTIFY THE SCHOOL ABOUT YOUR CHILD'S HEALTH

For students who have current health care plans, a letter will be sent home with a copy of the plan we currently have on file. Any changes to the plan can be placed on the plan and returned to school. Mrs Louise Smailes (HT Wellbeing) will also be available for parent meetings on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of September to update your child's health care plans.

We appreciate your assistance in this regard and assure you that any information you provide the school will be stored securely and will only be used or disclosed in order to support your son or daughter's health needs or as otherwise required by law.

# seven steps TO WRITING SUCCESS

## STEP 1: PLAN FOR SUCCESS

Year 8 Students have been continuing to improve their writing skills with the Seven Steps to Writing Success Program. Students have been learning how to plan for success when writing persuasive and narrative texts.

As part of this step, students were encouraged to brainstorm ten possible ideas for a story from one word such as 'cold' or 'run'. They then had to choose their best idea and brainstorm as a group all of the possible problems and people who could be involved in the story.

This then led to a discussion about the possible ways to end the story and to have an exciting ending. Students then learnt how to plot their story on a story graph.

The following are some fantastic examples of great story ideas from Year 8 students at RTHS about Ice Cream.

**Topic Ideas:** snow, ice, freezer, drinks, winter

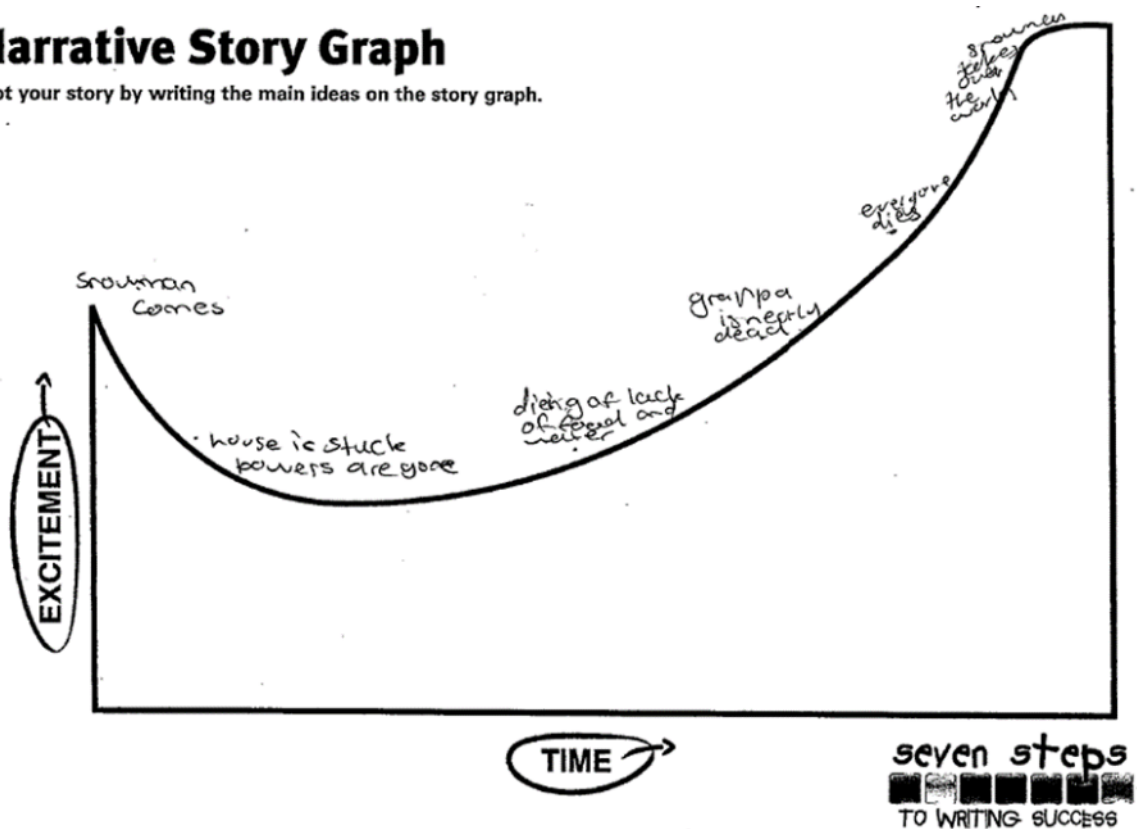
**Potential Problems:** block the doors, trapped in the snow, hyperthermia, sinking in the snow, getting frost bite, snow covering appliances, blizzards.

**People who could be there:** evil snowman, hero with snow powers, Grandpa who has hero powers

**Possible endings:** the hero will clear the snow, hero stops the storms, snowman rules the world, storms wipe out the world

## CYBER SAFETY PRESENTATION

On Friday 16<sup>th</sup> September years 7 -10 went to a presentation by Brett Lee from Internet Safe Education.

The unique quality and aspects of Internet Safe Education's approach are a result of the experience of former detective Brett Lee who worked as a Queensland Police Officer for 22 years, 16 of which as a detective in the field of Child Exploitation. Brett has been personally involved with the interview, location, arrest and prosecution of hundreds of online criminals and predators.

In his investigative role, Brett spent years and thousands of hours using the internet under the guise of fictitious children and adults, both male and female. This unprecedented view of the online world enables Brett to view the cyber world through the eyes of a child yet stand back and process this experience with the mind of an adult.

This knowledge has been formulated into clear learning messages within our training programs and presentations. The world behind the screen is revealed like never before, normalising the basic yet essential outcomes.

The presentation challenge student's mindsets and assumptions about the realities of the online world. This is achieved through real and sometimes confronting presentations with life lessons that can't be denied. In all of this, we aim to empower students with the knowledge they need to act responsibly in the online environment.

### Opal cards



Students have been using their Opal cards since the beginning of the year. Recent correspondence from the Regional Operations Manager of one of the bus services we use highlighted a number of key issues.

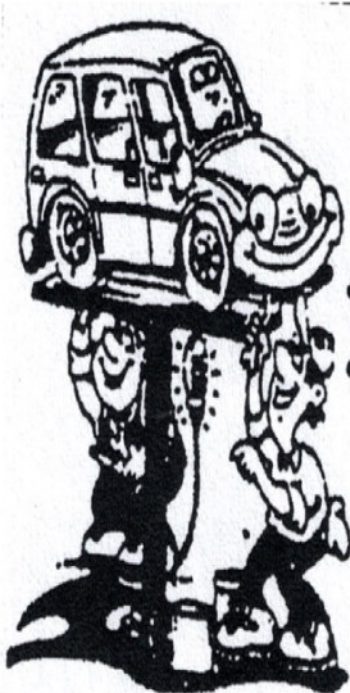

- Model and follow departmental, school and/or class codes of behaviour and conduct
- Negotiate and resolve conflict with empathy
- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions
- Care for self and others
- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behavior

### **Engagement**

- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Arrive at school and class on time
- Be prepared for every lesson
- Actively participate in learning
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments. The department provides a policy framework and resources such as Legal Issues Bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context the NSW Government and the Department of Education back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.
