Opal cards

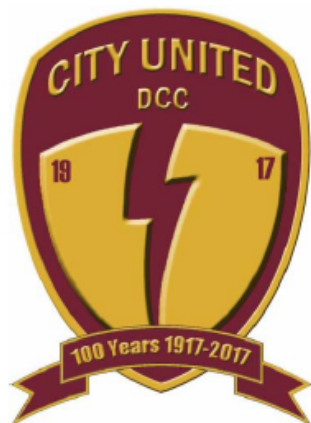

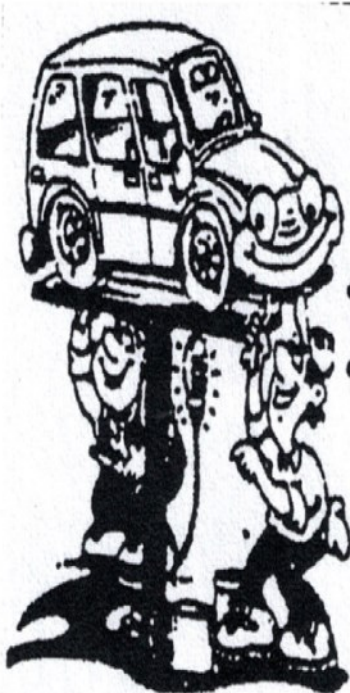

Behaviour Code for Students: Actions
