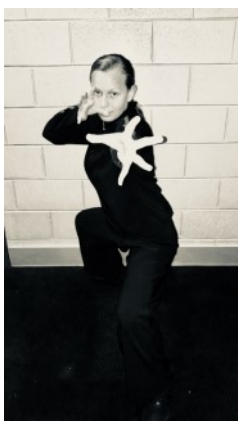

SCHOOLS SPECTACULAR!

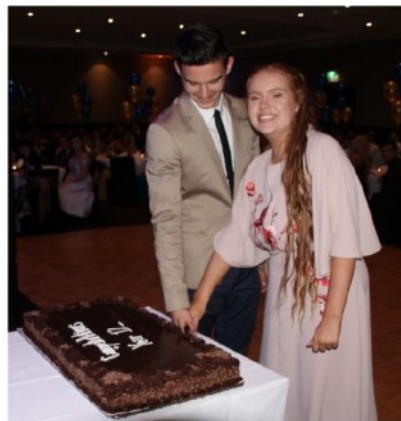

YEAR 6 TRANSITION PROGRAM

This term the 2018 Year Adviser (Ms Muller), the Assistant Year Adviser (Ms Rooney), and the Learning and Support teachers have visited all of our feeder primary schools, meeting with Year 6 teachers and getting to know Year 6 students. These visits enabled Year 6 students to learn a little about what to expect when starting high school, and also gave students the opportunity to ask any questions they may have.

Approximately 35 Year 6 students from our feeder primary schools have recently attended an intensive transition program conducted by the Learning and Support teachers from Rutherford Technology High School. 
