We have been notified of a number of our students being offered early round offers already and look forward to catching up with our students to hear about their successes in the future. Our Year 12 formal was held at Crowne Plaza Hunter Valley last Wednesday night. With 170 students, parents, friends and staff celebrating the successful completion of thirteen years of schooling. We would like to wish our departing Year 12 students all the best for their future and we hope they are successful in their endeavours.



### **WASTE OP COMPETITION**

Rutherford Technology High School is wasting no time, with hopes to clean up the top spot in the Waste Ops film competition. The 2018 Waste Ops short film competition, called for schools to enter their storyboards for a two-minute short film encouraging people to reduce the amount of waste they generate. Finalists Rutherford Technology High School and Kurri Kurri High School, as part of the competition, were given the opportunity to have their storyboards professionally filmed.

Week 4 has been a very busy time for our students completing their final year exams. We wish all students the best of luck and hope they are satisfied with their achievement for 2018.

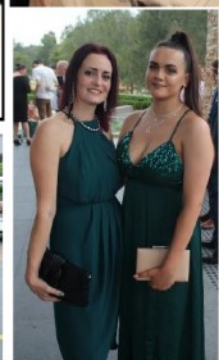
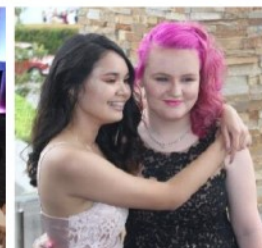
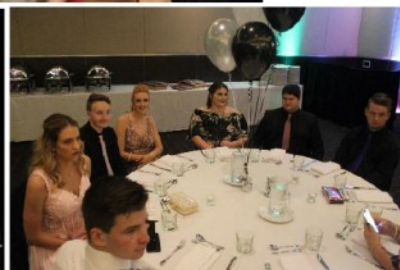
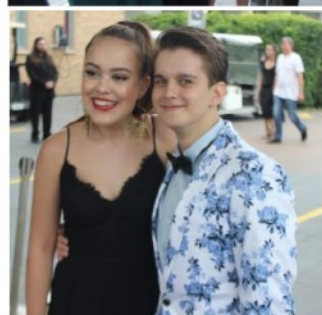
