


SENIOR EXECUTIVE REPORT EDUCATION WEEK

We are looking forward to new exciting events and opportunities like this in the next few semesters and hope that anyone who is interested in participating in these different events make sure they let their teachers know.



- Be an active listener
- Work down middle of page. NO full sentences. Use phrases.
- Record KEY words including technical terms/ subject specific.
- Skip small words like a, the, and, to.
- Use own words/ paraphrase.
- Use headings, sub-headings, numbers, letters, lists, bullet points.
- Indent to distinguish major/ minor points.
- Code notes colours, symbols abbreviations, acronyms, mnemonics.

Click on this link to access the Attendance Policy which is sets out the requirements for the attendance of students in NSW government schools.

Research indicates that:

- Regular attendance at school is fundamental to student learning. Students who attend school regularly are more likely to achieve educational success, and increase their career and life options.
- Student attendance has been identified as an important aspect of a student's wellbeing and failure to receive an education has been identified as a risk of harm factor.
- Poor patterns of attendance place students at risk of not achieving their educational, social and psychological potential and disadvantage them in the quality of choices they are able to make in later life situations.
- Communities benefit from students who regularly attend school and are achieving. These benefits include greater student safety, community wellbeing, and a sense of connectedness for all.
- Schools, families, and communities can work together to send a strong collective message about the importance of going to school.

Rutherford Technology High School is a Positive Behaviour for Learning School (PBL). Consequently this school is committed to the provision and implementation of a broad range of systematic and individualised strategies for improving school attendance, within a framework of student well-being, to enhance important social and learning outcomes for all students.

Rutherford Technology High School takes a positive approach to improving student attendance. Our school's 2018 Attendance Plan identifies and implements core values, practices and processes that support regular attendance and learning.

According to Departmental policy:

Parents are responsible for:

- Enrolling their children of compulsory school age in a government or registered non-government school or registering them with the Board of Studies NSW for home schooling
- Ensuring that their children attend school regularly
- Explaining the absences of their children from school promptly and within seven days to the school
- Taking measures to resolve attendance issues involving their children

At Rutherford Technology High School, at the beginning of each day the roll is marked electronically during roll call. This is the official school roll and indicates a student's daily attendance. The roll is also electronically marked each lesson.

After recess each day the school uses a SMS system to notify parents of unexplained late arrivals and unexplained whole day absence. If your child is absent from school, parents are legally required to notify the school, explaining the absence, within 7 days. This can be done in a number of ways:

- Phone or email If you know your child is going to be away from school please contact the school via phone (02 49325999) or email (rutherford-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au) to explain the absence.
- <u>Letter</u> on the day your child returns to school after an absence send a note explaining the absence. This note is to be handed in at the school Administration Office.
- Reply to SMS the school sends out an SMS message each day to notify parents that their child is absent. Please reply to the SMS stating if your child is sick or family business.

<u>Please note</u> – you can only reply to an SMS on the day it is sent, as the SMS number is only active for that day. Should you require assistance in saying **NO** to your child with regard to any absences other than genuine illness, please contact either Head Teacher Wellbeing or your child's year adviser. Let's work together to make a difference to your child's future.

PA4E1 Consent Forms/Information Packs in the Mail Early Term 3

Physical Activity for Everyone or PA4E1 is an Australian first program designed to help keep students physically active and healthy.

- If a parent/carer arrives to collect their child and it has not been pre-arranged, please be aware that it will take at least 15 minutes to have the student located and removed from class, which means the person collecting will have to wait in the front foyer.
- If a parent/carer contacts the school via telephone to inform that they will be collecting their child at a particular time they will be advised that this will not occur until they have actually arrived at the school and again it will take at least 15 minutes before the child will be at the front foyer. This is necessary protocol as the school has experienced situations where parents/carers do not arrive to collect the student at the specified time.
- The front office staff will not locate and remove students from class for collection from 3:00pm onwards unless in the case of an emergency.
- As you would be aware, disruptions to the classroom affects student's valuable learning time and these procedures are in place to minimise this occurring.
- In the case of an emergency, the school has alternative procedures in place.



IMPROVING LITERACY AND NUMERACY

ADVICE FOR PARENTS OF YEAR 10 STUDENTS

February 2018 update

A minimum standard of literacy and numeracy is required for your child to receive their Higher School Certificate (HSC).



Meeting the HSC minimum standard will mean that your child has the literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for success in learning and life after school.

THE ONLINE TESTS

Most students will show they have met the HSC minimum standard by passing minimum standard online tests. Students master basic skills at different stages so there are **multiple opportunities** available to pass the tests, from Year 10 until a few years after Year 12.



There are three 45-minute online tests:

- a multiple choice reading test
- a multiple choice numeracy test
- a short writing test based on a choice between a visual or written prompt

2017 NAPLAN TESTS

If your child achieved Band 8s or above in one or more of the 2017 Year 9 NAPLAN tests they are recognised as having met the HSC minimum standard in that area/s and will not need to sit the corresponding online test/s.

TEST DATES

Students will have two opportunities a year, from Year 10 until a few years after Year 12, to pass each online test.



The online test dates (school days only) for 2018 are:

- Term 1: 19 February to 23 March 2018
- Term 2: 21 May to 22 June 2018
- Term 3: 13 August to 14 September 2018
- Term 4: 5 November to 7 December 2018

WHAT TO EXPECT?

To help your child understand what to expect in the online tests, they are encouraged to visit educationstandards.nesa.nsw.edu.au/HSCminimumstandard to:



try demonstration questions to get a feel for the test format



view sample test questions and answers online



Your child's school may also organise short practice tests.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Some students with disabilities will be eligible for extra provisions for the minimum standard online tests, or an exemption from the HSC minimum standard requirement.

Students are encouraged to talk to their teachers to determine whether they are eligible for provisions. A Disability Provisions, Exemptions and Appeals policy, which contains further information, is available on the NESA website.
