MathsOnline is back!!

We have once again provided an on-line Mathematics tutorial program for all students at Rutherford Technology High School. MathsOnline is a very valuable resource, which will provide an enormous amount of support and extension for every student.

All students studying Mathematics from Year 7 to Year 12 have been given access to MathsOnline free of charge for at least the next 12 months. If they haven't been given their username and password, they need to see their classroom teacher ASAP.

Students can log in 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

We will be using it on a regular basis during Mathematics lessons, however, if students get in the habit of spending as little as 15-20 minutes each night using MathsOnline, the improvement seen in their mathematical skills and knowledge should be quite dramatic. Their Mathematics teacher may also decide to use this software as part of their classes' homework routine.

So, if you ask your child "do you have any homework?" and you get the usual response – nah! Perhaps suggest logging on to MathsOnline and choose a lesson to review. There is also a great "times tables" game to improve their skills.

For Year 7 and 9 students, MathsOnline has some very useful NAPLAN practice sections that are definitely worth a look.

Tutoring – the old fashion way

Maths tutoring is being offered each Wednesday and Thursday afternoons from 3:30 to 4:30 pm by members of the Mathematics faculty. This is held in K111 (opposite the maths staffroom).

Of course this is free of charge and **all** students from Year 7 to 12 are welcome to attend. Please note, parents/carers will be responsible for their child getting home on these afternoons.

Assessment Tasks

We are currently doing our first lot of assessment tasks in Mathematics for all years. This is a timely reminder that if your child misses the task on the due date, an **Illness/Misadventure appeal** form needs to be completed and submitted to the class teacher ASAP. If this is not submitted in a timely manner (regardless of whether the task has now been completed) a mark of zero will be awarded for that task. These forms can be obtained from the class teacher or from the Mathematics staffroom.

For students in Years 7, 8 and 9, a brief explanation as to why the task was missed and a parent/carers signature is all that is required.

Unfortunately for Years 10, 11 and 12, it is a NESA requirement that documentary evidence (doctors certificate or statutory declaration for example) is provided along with the illness/misadventure appeal form.

WELLBEING

The National Day of Action (NDA) against Bullying and Violence is scheduled for Friday 15th March. How parents can respond



Children and young people need to know that they are being heard, that their feelings matter and that their issue will be investigated respectfully. Bullying should be taken seriously.

Listen calmly and get the full story

Your calm response is important to allow your child to tell you all about the situation. After they've told you their story, ask questions to get more details if you need to: who, what, where, when.



Your first response when a child tells you of a concern can make a difference to the outcome.

Although you may feel some strong emotions about your child's experience, try to keep calm to avoid more distress to your child.

Reassure your child they are not to blame

Many children blame themselves and this may make them feel even worse.

You could say things like, 'That sounds really hard to deal with. No one should have to put up with that.' or 'I'm so glad you told me. You should be able to feel safe at school; that's not fair at all'.

Ask your child what they want to do and what they want you to do

A critical part of your response is to avoid jumping in to solve the problem.

While it is natural to want to protect your child, helping them to find their own solution is a better option. It helps them feel they have some power in the situation.

Learn some strategies to talk about with your child

These pages on the 'Bulling No Way' website provide tips and ideas for different bullying situations. One idea is to practice strategies at home to help your child feel more confident.

Contact the school

Your child may be reluctant for you to do this, so discuss the idea and reassure them that the school would want to know and is able to help.

Contact the school immediately if you have a concern about your child's safety.

Check in regularly with your child

Keep the conversation going. It can take time to resolve issues, so check in regularly with your child about their experiences and their feelings. Your ongoing support is important.

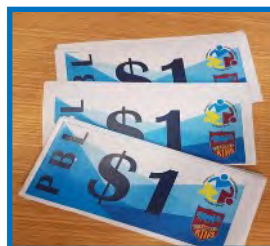
PBL NEWS

Please mark the date on the calendar and remember to ask your child to show you the personalized envelope when they receive it.



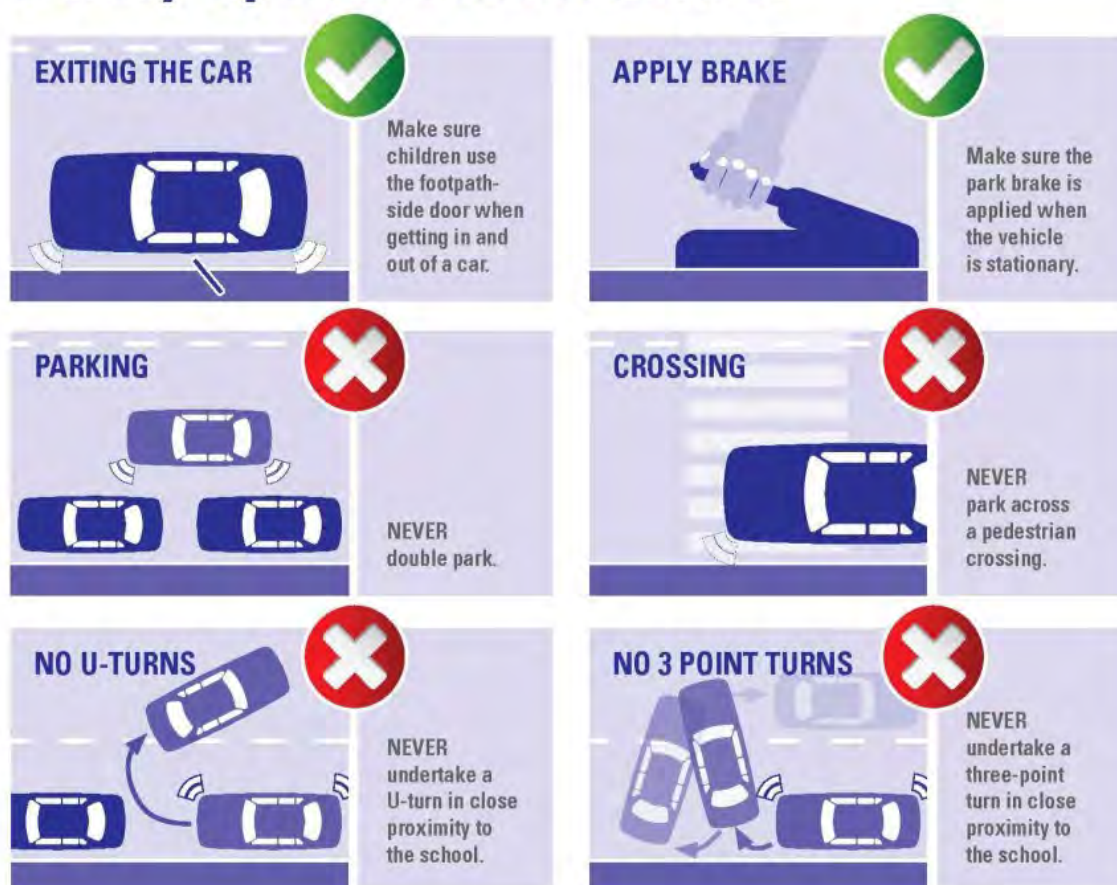
SCHOOL ZONES & SCHOOL CAR PARK

* The **Demerit Points** Scheme is a national program that allocates penalty points (demerits) for a range of driving offences. A driver who has not committed any offences has 'zero' points. If you commit an offence that carries demerit points, the points are added to your driving record. If you incur the threshold number of demerit points within a three-year period, a licence suspension or refusal is applied. The three-year period is calculated between the dates the offences were committed. It ends on the day your most recent offence was committed.

You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child but other children at risk. The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. **Please choose safety over convenience.**

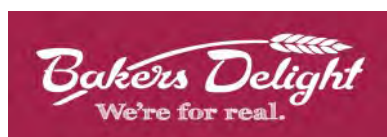
