PRESENTATION - Year 11 Students

Roadwhyz is a component of the compulsory Crossroads 25 hour program that all Year 11/12 students must undertake. It acknowledges and aims to support senior students as they address changing issues related to identity, independence and their changing responsibilities. One major aspect of this program is Road Safety Education. In 2019, all Year 11 students from Rutherford Technology High School will travel to Maitland High School on Friday 30th August to take part in this day which highlights key road safety messages which are particularly relevant for all new beginner drivers.

Students will listen to guest speakers from the NSW Police and Ambulance Services, as well as people who have lived through the events caused by road trauma. Please note that this program can be very confronting, students may have an emotional response to the program, however, teachers, the well-being staff and the school counsellor will be on hand to offer support if needed.

A detailed note will be sent home shortly with all students regarding the excursion.

WELLBEING REPORT

Attendance

This week over 250 students who had an attendance rate of 96% or above during Term 2, were invited to attend a BBQ to celebrate their excellent attendance at school. These students were demonstrating one of our school's PBL core values by committing to make regular attendance at school a priority.

Being reliable in attendance is a valuable habit for life and builds a connectedness between the students, their teachers and fellow students. Regular attendance is also one of the major factors contributing to a student's wellbeing and successful transition from a child to an adult. If a student is avoiding school then they are putting their future at risk.

Once it was the case that students only missed school when they were genuinely ill, however there is an increasing number of students who stay away from school for an ever increasing number of excuses including:

- A day off for their birthday
- A day because relatives are visiting
- A day off to be with parents at home
- A day off to look after younger brothers and sisters
- A day off to go shopping

Learning is sequential and missing school unnecessarily can make it difficult for our young people to keep up with, and understand the information being covered in class. School and parents have a legal responsibility to account for the whereabouts of young people daily. Should you require assistance in saying no to your child with regard to any absences other than genuine illnesses, please contact the school. Let's work together to make a difference to your child's future.

Reading Strategies

These strategies can be applied in all subject areas

Before Reading

- ♦ Think about what they already know about a subject
- ♦ Know the purpose for which they read
- ♦ Are motivated or interested to begin reading
- ♦ Have a general sense of how the BIG ideas will fit together

During Reading

- ♦ Pay simultaneous attention to words and meaning
- ♦ Read fluently
- ♦ Concentrate well while reading
- ♦ Willing to “risk” encountering difficult words and able to grapple with text ambiguities
- ♦ Construct efficient strategies to monitor comprehension
- ♦ Stop to use a “fix-it” strategy when confused
- ♦ Reading skills improve

After Reading

- ♦ Understand how the pieces of information fit together
- ♦ Able to identify what is salient
- ♦ Interested in reading more
