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#### **MESSAGE FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL**

The trial exams are nearly over and the attendance has been excellent, with Year 12 students taking these really seriously. Those students who needed support at the time were able to access it with our front office and teaching staff ready to go as always.

The Year 7 2022 GATs exam ran this week - again, the behaviour of these students was exceptional.

Congratulations to students following the health advice as they get onto buses. Many are carrying their own masks and those without are very polite as they ask for one of our spares to travel safely.

This year we have been setting high expectations around assessment through an increase in Letters of Concern going home to Year 7 to 9 for those students who have not been completing work. Thank you to those families who continue to work with us to ensure we can support their children to complete tasks to the best of their ability. A reminder that there is so much support for students and we recommend getting help in the lead up to a task if needed.

Onto a negative – such a small number of our students are letting our community down as they damage our toilets. Sometimes the decision is made to close these to attempt to protect that resource and ensure we can spend money on important things.

A reviewed uniform policy is currently in draft form and will be communicated to parents when finalised. No major changes to our uniform itself but some procedural clarification to ensure consistency. #### **HSIE FACULTY REPORT**

HSIE has had a busy and exciting start to Term 3. It has been great to welcome Ms Jemima Williams into the faculty, replacing Ms Zerbst who gained a permanent teaching position in Wagga Wagga at the end of Term 2.

The next semester for staff and students promises to be just as full and productive as the previous. Year 7 and Year 8 have begun their study of History, with Year 7 focusing on the Ancient World and Year 8 exploring Ancient China. Year 9 started their study of World War Two along with investigating the topic of Sustainable Biomes in Geography. In History Year 10 have started to explore Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War as a new topic the faculty developed and are continuing to examine the importance of Environmental Management for Geography. These topics bring students engaging opportunities to discover the world around them and develop critical thinking skills. Currently all our students in Years 7-10 for History are completing Historical Investigation Assessment Tasks. This requires students to complete a historical inquiry on a chosen topic and present their findings. To support students with these assessment tasks and to develop their writing skills the HSIE staff are offering a new initiative *"HSIE Writing and Hot Chocolates"*. Students in Years 7-12 are encouraged to come to K2 from 8:00am of a Thursday morning to work on assessment tasks and extended writing whilst having a hot chocolate.

Year 12 have also been busy, completing their Trial HSC Exams for HSIE. All students are encouraged to revise their results and practice rewriting extended responses questions to develop their knowledge and understanding further. In the lead up to the HSC it is crucial students are continuing to complete their study of content, developing topic summaries following the course syllabus and answering past examination questions. 2021 Society and Culture students are to be congratulated for their work on their Personal Interest Projects (PIP). Additionally, we received some excellent History Extension Major Works that students should be very proud of. We wish Year 12 the best of luck for their upcoming HSC exams and remind students that we are happy to provide any assistance they may need during this time. 

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HSC students will be given more time to work on their major projects and to prepare for exams to reduce the impact of the current COVID-19 lockdown.

The NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) COVID-19 Response Committee has announced additional changes to the 2021 HSC timetable to give students additional time to prepare for upcoming HSC exams.

In recognition of the evolving COVID-19 situation and in line with health advice, NESA will:

- Extend the hand in date for all major projects by two weeks. The hand-in date for Industrial Technology has been extended by four weeks.
- Reschedule Drama performance exams to run from 6th to 17th September.
- Music performance exam continue as scheduled, running from 30th August to 10th September.
- Reschedule the written exams to begin one week later on 19th October and conclude on 12th November with HSC results out on 17th December.

- their teenager has stopped confiding in or being open with them
- their teenager has become moody and irritable
- their teenager has been having difficulties with school, such as low attendance, study stress or peer pressure
- their teenager is spending more time online than usual, especially on social media.

This cycle we have asked our students to reflect on our core school values and their experiences at school. Apart from providing us a chorus of student insights; this process in itself holds an important lesson, that of reflective thinking. As the above quote suggests, we filter the world with our attitude. So, if we are able to look at *how* we are thinking whilst looking back on what we experienced, we learn and hopefully grow.

The PBL team are always reflecting on how to improve the student and staff experience at Rutherford Technology High School. We review our procedures, reward systems and celebrations, and messages we send to students (both explicit and implicit) every term; and the data we receive from students helps shape our decisions for the future. Such an example is our decision to modify the rewards afternoon for this term. Due to COVID and the uncertainty that it brings, this term we have asked students to write their name on the back of their 'B-Bucks' in order to go into a raffle for a number of monetary awards – one draw per year group. Hopefully in time we will be able to return to the rewards afternoons, which are relished by students and staff alike.

In talking about the experiences and the effect our outlook can have on our perception (re-read the quote for clarification), I'd like to share a recent teaching moment – the teacher was me, and in reflection *the lesson was for me as well*. I lamented the fact that I had a certain class after a break. They are all great kids, but as class they can sometimes be a challenge. As I made my way to the classroom, I played out every possible negative scenario in my head, letting myself down with every step. In short, I was preparing myself for a shocker! The way I greeted the class was ho-hum, I barked a bit at first and probably sighed in resignation as well. As the lesson progressed, the class was not meeting my expectations! – they were behaving perfectly. Most students completed the tasks I had prepared without any fuss and distractions were at a minimum, disruptions non-existent. I returned to the staffroom wondering what went right? The problem was me. My preconceived ideas set me up for failure, but the kids delivered and proved to me that my attitude was shaping the world I thought I was set to endure. Now as teachers we are taught not to carry baggage from one lesson to the next - to reset. Now, whilst I didn't transfer particular incidents from one period to another, I did enter with assumptions – which are the mother of all stuff ups.

So, to finish...take time to reflect on your mindset and *then* take a look outside.




