Thank you to our hard-working Aboriginal Education Team led by Mrs Michelle Keyes for the week of activities and cultural education.



It's that time of year – The Australian Mathematics Competition Week 3 Term 3, 2023


A great opportunity for students to challenge themselves and show their mathematical ability.

You don't need to be at the top of the class to be great problem solvers, and this is how the mathematics competition lets you shine!

Over 1,000 students share the prizes and around 50% of participants qualify to receive a Certificate of High Distinction, Distinction or Credit. All other entrants in the competition receive a Certificate of Participation or a Proficiency Certificate. All students are provided with a detailed report showing how they performed on each problem with wider statistical rankings.

Rutherford Technology High School will be holding the competition on Friday 4th August 2023. Notes have been distributed to students who wish to participate and are due back no later than Friday 28th July 2023. The school will again be covering the cost of each student participating.
