MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

We have come to the end of a very busy and challenging term. Our school continues to grow as we welcome more students to our classes, and we also welcomed new members of staff. We all wish you a happy retirement.



Reports Years 7-10 and Attendance

Reports will be issued to students this week via the parent portal. I believe that the teacher comments are at least as important than the marks and grades, if not more so. It is the comments that tell us how the student is progressing and what they need to do to improve. I encourage parents and carers to sit down with their child and read through the whole report together to get a better picture of how their child is doing. For some, this will be an easy conversation, while, for others, not so much. Reports also include information on your child's attendance. Please take the time to discuss with your child and emphasise the importance of attending school and the impact that missing school can have on learning. Did you Know - If your child misses as little as 1 day per week, they will miss 40 days of school and 8 weeks of learning in 1 year. Over an entire school journey, this adds up to 2.5 years of lost learning. Did you know that all students in NSW public schools are expected to have an attendance rate of 95% or above? This is because absences add up and can impact your child's learning more than you think. That's why making sure your child comes to school every single day (unless genuinely sick) is so important. If you have concerns about your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to contact with Mr Ben O'Leary, Deputy Principal Attendance.

Abundance of Student Extra-Curricular Activity

My thanks to our staff for supporting students to access so many extra-curricular activities for our students. 

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SYDNEY JEWISH MUSEUM

WHERE HISTORY HAS A VOICE

Onigiri is food made from white rice formed into triangular or cylindrical shapes and often wrapped in *nori*. Traditionally, an onigiri is filled with pickled ume, salted salmon, katsuobushi, kombu, tarako, mentaiko, takanazuke or any other salty or sour ingredient as a natural preservative. Nowadays, most Japanese convenience stores and supermarkets stock their onigiri with various fillings and flavours.

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

Steps for paying and selecting sports:

Payments and selection can be made at the office and online via School Bytes.

Please note sport venues are capped and will not be visible for payment or selection when there are no vacancies left.

When selecting a sport online, School Bytes will automatically redirect to the online payment portal. You have 15 minutes to complete payment before preferences are invalidated.

If choosing a paying bus venue sport — weekly fees MUST be paid to the venue each week. At school team sports — these will also be capped and will not require payment to be made before selection. It is advised if your child wishes to be in a particular team sport with their peers that the correct (same) team number be selected.

If students do not select a sport, they will be placed into a school team sport (no cost).

Online permission will be emailed out prior to sport commencement.

NO CHANGES WILL BE MADE TO SPORTS GROUPS DURING THE TERM. (Changes will only be made if students show unacceptable behaviour at external sport venues).

Please call the office if you need any assistance with sport payment and selection.



What is the Careers NSW school trial?

Group career exploration sessions for students in Years 7-10

Gain self-awareness, motivation, aspiration, and confidence. You will be exposed to career development concepts, career myths, explore different jobs and industries and learn how to recognise your skills and achievements. Group career exploration sessions are organised by your school and held in-person at school.

Careers appointments for students in Years 9-12

Attend an appointment with a qualified careers practitioner and talk through career development topics including your interests, skills, job opportunities, industries, and employers and how to choose relevant future training and education opportunities. You can also learn skills like how to develop a resume.

Student careers appointments are available virtually and in-person at school:

i. Virtual appointments

Organise a virtual appointment and access personalised careers guidance at times convenient to you outside of school hours (subject to appointment availability) on the Careers NSW Schools website. If you're 18 you can book these appointments yourself. If you're under the age of 18 your parent or carer can book appointments for you.

ii. In-person appointments at school

Access in person appointments with a careers practitioner at your school. The benefit of inperson appointments is that you may access valuable careers resources during free periods, your lunchtime or as your study schedule allows (subject to appointment availability and school scheduling). Your school will book these appointments on your behalf.

Parent and carer information discussion with a careers practitioner

Your parent or carer can book and attend an information discussion with a careers practitioner to discuss your career development.

Discussion topics include how your parents can help you recognise your interests and skills, identify job opportunities, explore industries and employers' networks and help you explore future courses, training, and education.

Mock interview appointments for students in Years 9-12

Practise job interview techniques and get tips and advice on what to say and do in an interview. If you're in Years 9-12, you can book and attend a virtual mock interview appointment with a careers practitioner. Your parent or carer will book these appointments if you are under the age of 18.

If you're in Years 11 or 12, you can also access inperson mock interview appointments at school. You can ask your school to book these for you.

Career development presentations

Learn about career development concepts such as job search, resumes and job applications, networking and interviews. Your school will organise career development presentations.

Career development workshops

Workshop style group facilitation – experience career development concepts such as resume writing, looking at resume examples, or get to practice your interview or networking skills. Your school will organise career development workshops.

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



Method of Delivery


This qualification is delivered with practical's completed on campus in our simulated salon environment while theory is completed through our online study portal. Students must have access to a computer and internet to fulfill the online course requirements. Students will be required to schedule and perform services on paying clients as part of assessment.

Duration of Course

Delivered over 15 weeks, students are needed to complete 15 hours per week online, and 6.5hours on campus per week for in salon training.

Students are required to participate in work experience for a total of 25 hours over the duration of this qualification.


