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CAREERS FACULTY REPORT

Term 3 in Careers - This term has been action-packed with incredible opportunities for our students.

RAAF Williamtown Indigenous Youth Program

Indigenous students participated in this exciting program, exploring career pathways within the Royal Australian Air Force through hands-on activities and mentorship from Indigenous RAAF personnel.

EPP Headstart Programs

Several students have kick-started their careers early through the Educational Pathways Program, gaining real-world experience in:

- **Metal Fabrication** at Zeal
- **Plumbing** at TAFE
- **Maritime Studies** at MAST Training, Wickham

Maitland Hospital Orientation

Students required to complete orientation for work experience at Maitland Hospital gained valuable insights into the healthcare environment and the range of career options available in the medical field.

HMAS Excursion

An exciting excursion to HMAS allowed students to explore various trades within the defence force, highlighting opportunities in areas such as engineering, mechanics, and other technical roles in the Navy.

Youth in Business Pilot Program

A very successful pilot program for Youth in Business, run by Youth Express and funded by ETC (Enterprise & Training Company), introduced students to entrepreneurship. They developed practical business skills, created their own logo designs, and even had these printed on shirts and hoodies.

EVET (External Vocational Education & Training) - TAFE Applications for 2025

So far, **34 applications** for EVET (TAFE) courses for the 2025 intake have been submitted. A second round of applications will open **Monday of Week 8, Term 4**, providing another opportunity for students to apply.

Year 10 into Year 11 Subject Selection Interviews

Subject selection interviews for Year 10 students transitioning into Year 11 have begun and will continue into early next term. These interviews provide essential guidance in helping students choose the right subjects aligned with their future career goals.

Year 12 University Applications and Careers Support

A significant number of our Year 12 students intend on furthering their education at university in 2025. Today, there are a wide range of pathways that students can take to gain admission into a university program. These are:

- Meeting the ATAR benchmark through their HSC performance
- Early entry application direct to the university
- Schools Recommendation Scheme via UAC (Universities Admission Centre)
- Vocational Education & Training (VET) entry using a Certificate III qualification
- Entry via Subject Spotlight Scheme (outstanding performance in a HSC subject related to a degree. Eg. Physics and an Engineering Degree)

In 2024, Rutherford Technology High School has had 28 Year 12 students who have applied for university study in 2025. 23 students have already been offered a place in a university program, some students have received a number of early offers. An offer rate of 82% before even sitting HSC exams is very impressive.

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Year 10 Rights and Freedoms Excursion

On Thursday of Week 9, HSIE staff took 40, Year 10 and 11 students to the State Library of NSW in Sydney to view archives relating to the Australian Civil Rights Movement. Both our Year 10 and Year 11 students have been studying this period of history and were enthusiastic about broadening their understanding through the state library's program.

Once we arrived at the library, students engaged in a two-hour program focusing on artefact analysis and archival source-work. In one part of this program, students were led by a library guide around their extensive array of archival materials, photographs and significant relics from the Civil Rights era.

Both Year 10 and 11 alike were in awe when learning about the stories and struggles of Indigenous Australians in this time, taking particular interest in the gallery room which displayed an array of paintings.

The second half of this program was set in the classroom, where students learnt how to access and explore the libraries digital archives and use them for future school assessments and personal interest. They focused in on the Australian Freedom Rides of 1965 and existing photographs of the journey to hone their source analysis skills and develop their capabilities as historians.

Once we had completed our visit, students found lunch in Darling Harbour and were given time to explore this area of Sydney before making the journey home. All students who attended this excursion were outstanding representatives of our school, with members of the public making comment to myself on their excellent behaviour. A special thank you to Mr Schwab and Miss Atkinson for their assistance on the day and guidance in the creation of this amazing opportunity for our students. And, of course, a big thank you to Years 10 and 11 for an enjoyable day of learning.

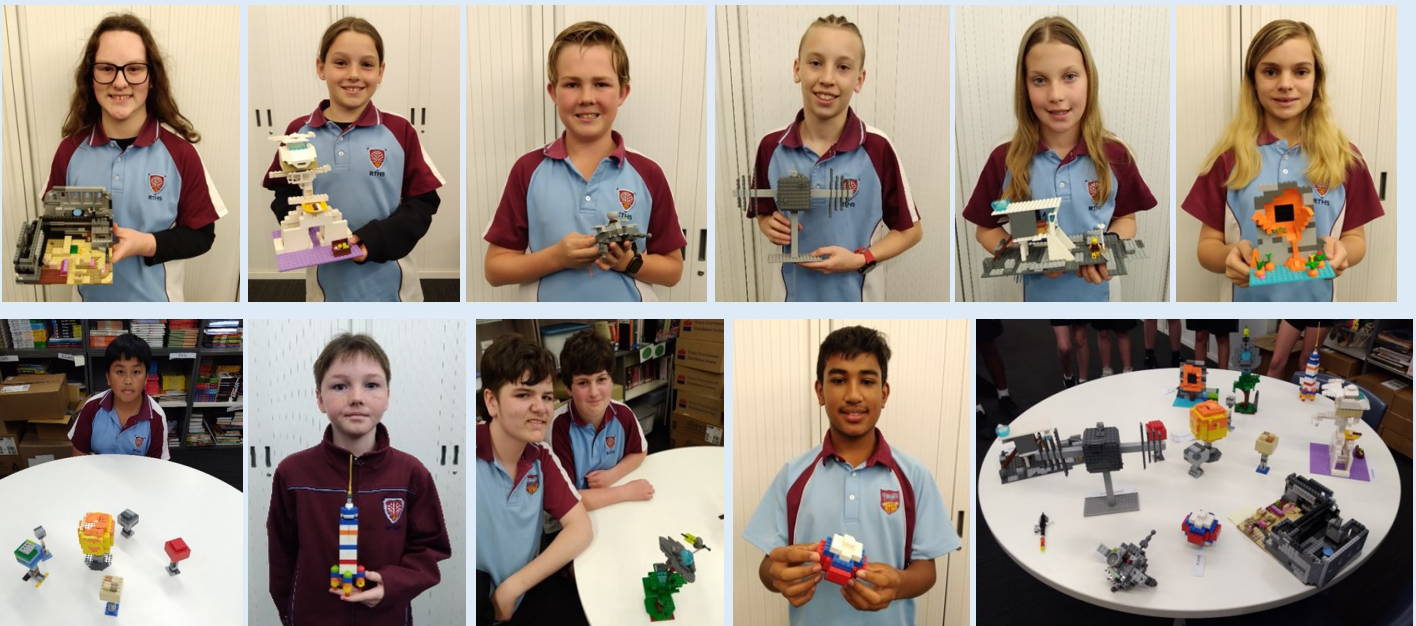
