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MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

2024 - That's a Wrap

As we finish school for 2024, I would like to thank the Rutherford Technology High School community for their support and contribution to student outcomes throughout the year.

This year has been another positive year for continued school improvement. We have completed a number of projects that continue to raise the standard of our setting with installation of our new disabled lift in the MPC, the electronic digital sign in the bus bay, our Rugby League health and fitness hub. Thank you to our generous P&C for additional chilled water coolers, as well as, a new school bus.

I would like to congratulate Year 12 2024 students and our staff who supported their completion of the HSC. This year our results continued trending in a positive direction with a number of outstanding student results. Kalynda Marriott topped the cohort, with all other students that are university bound, by already being offered university placement through the early entry scheme. We also have a number of students who have been successful in obtaining apprenticeships and traineeships.

It was incredibly pleasing to see the increased numbers of community who supported the various School Achievement Recognition Ceremony and Presentation Day this year. The extensive representation of student achievement was testament to the hard work and partnerships between students, staff and the community.

In 2025 we will be commencing a new School Improvement Plan. This will have a deep focus on student behaviour that is respectful, safe and engaged, explicit teaching, high performance and gifted education, whilst improving reading, numeracy and writing skills across all year groups. In addition, we will be formalising structures that track and support all Year 12 students in their preferred post-school pathway. We will work hard at strengthening the partnership between our school, our students and our community to ensure we work together.

Public Health Alert: Whooping Cough

NSW Health has reported that the incidence of whooping cough is at a 15-year high. The highest rates are seen in school-aged children aged 5 to 16 years.

Whooping cough starts like a cold with a blocked or runny nose, sneezing, a mild fever and an occasional cough. Coughing bouts can worsen and be followed by vomiting, choking or taking a big gasping breath which causes a "whooping" sound. The cough can last for many weeks and can be worse at night. Children and adults may just have a mild cough that doesn't go away. In adults the cough commonly lasts 5–7 weeks, sometimes longer.

Adolescents are offered a free pertussis vaccine through the Year 7 school vaccination program, as immunity decreases following their early childhood vaccines. GPs can administer free catch-up vaccination to children and adolescents for those who have missed doses. Pharmacists can also administer these free for children aged 5-19 years. The best protection against pertussis infection is vaccination.

Large outbreaks of whooping cough usually occur every 3 to 4 years as population immunity decreases. Lower exposure to whooping cough during the COVID-19 pandemic is a likely reason for this current increase.

If you think you or a family member might have whooping cough - If you or your child's situation is life-threatening, please call Triple Zero (000) or present to your nearest emergency department immediately. If it's not an emergency, call Healthdirect on 1800 022 222 if you or your child are unwell and you're not sure where to go. Healthdirect is free and available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. A nurse will answer your call, ask some questions and connect you with the right care.

If given early, antibiotics can reduce the duration of whooping cough symptoms. After 5 days of treatment with appropriate antibiotics, people with whooping cough are no longer infectious. Without treatment, they will remain infectious for 21 days. Antibiotics are rarely needed if it has been 3 weeks since cough onset. We also farewell a number of temporary SASS and SLSO staff. Their collective contribution has been outstanding for our students and we wish them well in their future endeavours. Despite the ongoing staffing challenges, we will start 2025 with a full complement of qualified teaching staff.

I would like to wish all our students, parents and community members a safe and relaxing holiday. Our students return to school on Thursday 6th February 2025 for all students.

Faculty Reports

ICT FACULTY REPORT



The ICT and LOTE Faculty have worked hard to provide great projects and activities for all students to participate in this year. From Robotics competitions and online coding competitions to Japanese cooking experiences, both faculty areas wish all students a safe and relaxing holiday and hope to see everyone back next year.

Stage 4 students in ICT have enjoyed designing characters and building 2D games within their mini electives. The digital technology students have learnt to safely browse the internet and use coding to enhance their understanding of technology. Students across the school are encouraged to keep up to date with the latest technologies to survive in a rapidly changing society.

Stage 5 ICT students have been introduced to an interactive and project-based year by taking part in the new Computing Technology curriculum. This year, students created 3D video games using the Unity Game Engine and analysed data related to the last 30 years of video game sales. The students were also assessed on their ability to visualise their interest areas by collecting data related to something they enjoy doing, eg. time on technology, basketball results and fitness tracking. Next year students should look forward to Automate Mechatronic Systems and learning how to design apps for mobile devices.

As our Stage 6 students begin Year 11 and continue to delve further into software-based industries in Year 12, our students have involved themselves in a range of challenges and continue to gain job ready skills. We have several students completing both a TAFE qualification in IT and learning the backend skills of Software Engineering. These students are encouraged to continue to practice their skills at home and look for any opportunity to develop examples of their work. These practical experiences can enhance students opportunities at the end of their studies and potentially set themselves up for life.

Upcoming events in 2025 to listen out for are:

Code Quest - Challenges high school teams to tackle real-world problems crafted by Lockheed Martin engineers.

Big Day In IT - Is an IT careers conference designed by students for students.

NCSS Challenge - Programming competitions teach students to code in Python.

RoboCup Junior - Project-oriented educational initiative that sponsors local, regional, and international robotic events for young students.

2025 Australian Schools Cyber Challenge - Is designed to provide students with an engaging way to learn vital technical cyber security skills.





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LOTE FACULTY REPORT

This year we have continued to integrate more technology within the learning of Japanese language. All Year 8 students have immersed themselves in the differing perspective of Japanese culture. These topics have included booking holidays in Japan, experiencing a range of foods and engaging in using new language structures to aid when using the Japanese language.

"Improved memory: using your brain to learn a new language can improve your memory — it's like a workout for your brain! It helps with multitasking: if you can jump from one language to another, chances are you can type, talk on the phone and eat your lunch at the same time."



While in Stage 5 Japanese, students further enhanced their ability to speak fluent Japanese and incorporate seasonal activities into their learning experiences. From participating in Setsubun and decorating the classroom with Cherry Blossom leaves, to learning about the moon during Otsukimi. Students learnt about both "imasu" (animated objects) and "arimasu" (inanimate objects) within this course through the tales within Japanese folklore. It is a great opportunity for students to gain an increased knowledge of the history of differing cultures.




Final Year 7 Library Lesson Task
