Week 2 and HSC Examinations are well underway with many Year 12 students feeling positive walking out of their exams. While some smiling faces are relieved that the exams are over. Many have been very happy about the content of the exams and how they answered the questions. With some students being able to celebrate the end of their exam period already, others will be looking forward to the end, with the last exam being the 8th of November. A short while after this, we are looking forward to celebrating Year 12's achievements at their Formal on 12th of November and their Graduation Ceremony on 14th of November. A very exciting time for them. We wish students luck with all they are embarking on for the rest of this term and in the future. They have achieved so much already and should be proud of their achievements. I'm sure celebrations will be had when HSC results are released on 18th of December.

To ensure more timely or immediate dealings with issues, it is very helpful when students directly involved are able to report and provide details and first hand information, this greatly assists the resolution process. While students have Year Advisers and Assistant Year Advisers, Head Teachers and Deputy Principals they can report to, they can also report to a trusted staff member with whom they feel comfortable to discuss their concerns. Early reporting of issues is also very helpful in preventing incidents before they occur. This enables us to resolve situations and provide the necessary support for students.

Finally, while we are on the last leg of 2024 there is still a lot happening before we wrap up the year. Junior years will be undertaking their final assessments and yearly examinations, Semester 2 reports and End of year presentations.

October is Mental Health month and it is good to put spotlight the importance of mental health which can often go unnoticed or unspoken about. 
CHANGE TO SCHOOL OPERATIONS ON MONDAY 28th OCTOBER 2024



<u>TERM 4: WEEK 1</u> NEURANEXT AI AND ROBOTICS

On Friday of Week 1 Term 4, Year 9, 10 and 11 students were invited to learn more about the changing nature of A.I. and its use within Robotics. Students learnt about A.I. via a series of live interactive implementations of the technology including computer vision, autonomous cars & robotics.





Between watching an autonomous car drive around a track and having the opportunity to walk a Robotic dog, students enjoyed learning about the impact Al has made so far.

With the changing workforce and the inclusion of AI in all industries, students are encouraged to gain micro credentials in both AI and Cyber Security.

Male applicants with AI studies received an interview invitation in 54% of cases, whereas male applicants without AI studies were invited to interview in 28% of cases.

Female applicants with AI studies received an interview invitation in 50% of cases, whereas female applicants without AI studies received one in 32% of cases.


Before school


- Schoolwork access is from 8:20am each morning.
