

A huge thank you to Library SASS member Mrs Smith for her assistance in running the in-school competition. She is always there ready to help the students out whenever it is needed.



The officer positions determined at the AGM, according to both Standard and Prescribed Constitution are:


President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Canteen Treasurer, Public Officer and Finance Committee



Children in the care of Stewart House attend a specific purpose school onsite for eight (8) days of their 12-day stay. The NSW Department of Education provides infrastructure and staffing support for this school. All other costs associated with the children's' stay are met from charitable donations.




