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#### **CAREERS/VET FACULTY REPORT**

Term 2 was full of exciting opportunities for Rutherford Technology High School students to explore, experience, and expand their career horizons. From industry qualifications to excursions and immersive programs, here's a look at what our students have achieved:



#### **Applying for University Workshop**

As part of our Year 12 HSC Skills program university-focused students attended a workshop providing key information on applying for university, early entry programs and scholarships. This session gave students the knowledge to take the next step in their future study pathway.



#### **HSC Seminar Day**

30 academically driven Year 12 students attended the HSC Seminar Day at Singleton High School. Students had the privilege to learn tips and tricks from HSC markers and experienced teachers on how to maximise their HSC exam performance and achieve their academic personal best (PB).





#### **Careers and Coffee Afternoon**

We hosted our first Careers and Coffee Afternoon for Year 10 families, where students, parents and carers gathered for a relaxed Q&A session. With great conversations we unpacked pathway options, support services, and the value of early career planning heading into senior years.

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#### Employment Pathways Program (EPP) Initiatives

The Employment Pathways Program continued to offer targeted support. Students engaged in tailored career readiness workshops and supported learning activities that built confidence, employability, and motivation. A huge success in helping students prepare for life beyond school.

TAFE 'Start Your Future' – Term 2 Short Courses

Several students enrolled in TAFE short courses across various industries – from healthcare to trades – gaining real skills and insights into future study or work options.

#### • HeadStart Pre-Apprenticeship – Metal Fabrication

Seven students from RTHS took part in this hands-on program, learning the tools and techniques of metal fabrication and getting a taste of life as a tradesperson. A valuable first step toward apprenticeships and trade careers.

Hunter Tourism Explorer – Hunter Valley Gardens Excursion

Students explored the tourism and events industry with a guided excursion through Hunter Valley Gardens. The experience highlighted behind-the-scenes roles in landscaping, hospitality, and event planning.





#### **Daracon Work Site Visit**

Our visit to Daracon offered students a unique glimpse into civil construction. From traffic control to large-scale project management, the experience connected classroom learning to real-world application. Also included, was an 8-Day Work Experience Program for 5 students keen to find work with the company.



#### Hunter Valley Careers Expo

A highlight of the term, the Hunter Valley Career Expo gave students direct access to employers, TAFE, universities, and training organisations. Students were able to ask questions, gather information, and discover pathways they may not have considered before.



#### 144 Year 10 Careers Interviews Completed

In a massive effort to support future planning, our Careers Team conducted 144 individual interviews with Year 10 students. These one-on-one sessions helped students reflect on their strengths, interests, and post-school goals, while also identifying suitable senior subjects, VET options, and work experience pathways.



#### **Ongoing Work Experience**

Throughout Term 2, over 20 students from Year 10 and above participated in personalised work experience placements. From early childhood education to retail, trades, and administration, students are getting real-world experience to test the waters in industries they're passionate about.

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#### Advanced Manufacturing - Robotics & Electronics Course

A select group of students took part in a week-long Advanced Manufacturing program, diving into the world of robotics, electronics, and smart systems. Hosted in a purpose-built training environment, the program gave students hands-on experience with cutting-edge technologies shaping the future of industry.



#### **Maitland Hospital Orientation Day**

Students interested in health and medical careers attended a special orientation day at Maitland Hospital. This was a prerequisite for future work experience placements at the hospital, giving students a glimpse into patient care, allied health, nursing, and hospital operations



#### White Card & First Aid Courses

Two White Card courses and one First Aid course were delivered to give students essential certifications for safe entry into the workplace.

## Stand Tall 2025


#### What a Day!
