Regular attendance at school is essential for students to achieve quality life outcomes. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students. Parents or carers of children of compulsory school age (6 to 17) are responsible for ensuring their child attends school every day.

Ideally all students should have a yearly average percentage of above 90%.

If your child is struggling to come to school for the following reasons:

Issues in the Learning Environment

If your child is experiencing difficulty with school work, or experiencing issues with other students in the learning environment, please contact a year group Deputy Principal to discuss your concerns and to develop strategies to overcome this.

Anxiety

If your child is struggling to get to school due to anxiety then your first point of call is to contact the school and speak to the year group Deputy Principal, or the Year adviser and the school will work with you to find the best alternative for your child. In cases of severe anxiety, you will need to provide a medical certificate from your GP, our wellbeing team will develop a plan looking at in-school solutions or an alternative learning setting.

Refusing

If your child is refusing to come to school please make an appointment with the Deputy Principal of Attendance to discuss the issue and develop a plan to improve your child's attendance.

What Should I do if my child is absent from school?

If children are absent from school, parents and carers are required to provide the school with an acceptable explanation within seven days of the absence.

Explanations regarding attendance can be provided in the following ways:

- Phone or email If you know your child is going to be away contact the school via phone (02 4932 5999) or email (rutherford-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au).
- ▶ Letter On the day your child returns to school after an absence send a note explaining the absence. This note can be handed in at the school administration office.
- Reply to SMS The school sends out an SMS message each day to notify parents that their child is absent. Please reply to the SMS stating if your child is absent due to sickness or family business.

Medical Certificates

After three days of absence, we require a medical certificate for any sickness which can be emailed to the school.

Language Faculty Update

Year 8 students have been diving into their language studies with enthusiasm. They have explored Japanese geography, major cities, and learned how to write and say their names in Japanese. Some classes had the opportunity to dress up in a traditional kimono and yukata, as well as other outfits like karate uniforms and samurai attire. They have also been practicing self-introductions and have begun learning vocabulary for countries, cities, and towns. Year 9 students have been strengthening their Japanese writing skills by focusing on both hiragana and katakana, building their confidence in reading and writing. They are also partway through the family topic, where they have been learning how to describe their own families and talk about relationships using key vocabulary and sentence structures. Their dedication to mastering the basics is setting a strong foundation for their continued language learning.

Meanwhile, Year 10 students have been reinforcing their foundational skills as they begin the money and shopping unit. They recently enjoyed their first cooking lesson of the term, preparing delicious teriyaki chicken with noodles. Students are encouraged to develop strong study routines to stay on top of their learning and make the most of their language studies.

We look forward to another fantastic term ahead.

OPAL CARDS

All students are required to have a school opal card to travel on trains. Student opal cards are issued to students upon application at the schools administration office.

Students must tap their card on at the beginning of the journey and tap their card off when they reach their destination.

If a student does not have an opal card and or does not tap on and off as required, they can be fined under the Passenger Transport Regulation 2007.

Our staff are happy to assist by showing students how to use opal cards correctly.

SAFETY

Students are reminded to remain behind the yellow line at all times unless boarding or alighting form the train.

Students are asked not to make contact with a moving train as it enters or departs the station. IE: running their hands along the length of the train. Making contact with moving trains is very dangerous and can result in serious injury.

CCTV surveillance cameras are operational at all train stations 24 hours a day and monitor all movements.

Help Points are provided at Train Stations in case of emergency.

Rubbish bins are provided at all stations for the students convenience. Littering is not permitted and fines also apply for not complying.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

This is a general reminder that the moratorium period has now ended.

It is crucial that students are enrolled for the 'School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS). The moratorium period allowed eligible students who have not yet ordered a student bus pass to order one and continue catching bus services in the meantime.

All bus passes applied for during the moratorium period have been sent via Australia Post to the respective addresses. If you have not yet received your bus pass, however did order one, please contact our office. Grace Coaches does not accept Opal Cards.

If students do not present a bus pass when utilising our services, they will be asked to order one. Children consistently not presenting a bus pass after counselling will be refused entry onto our services.

Flexischools Order Process

As previously advised, our canteen has a process for Flexischools order. This process is to ensure we do not have large amounts of food wastage due to caregivers/students who have placed an order through Flexischools from either being absent, arriving late or leaving early. food wastage affects the operating costs.

Flexischools orders for canteen staff is as follows:

- 9:00am cut off and orders printed.
- After first break any orders not collected, the item/s will be returned to stock.
- After first break canteen staff will provide our school administration office with a list of orders for second break to allow staff to check system for attendance. If a student is absent at this time the order will not be filled.
- Each day, all orders either not collected or unable to be filled due to a student being absent will be destroyed.

PLEASE NOTE THIS MEANS THAT NO ORDERS WILL BE HELD OVER

We request that if a student has an order through Flexischools and they will be absent that you login to Flexischools <u>before</u> 9:00am to cancel the order. Cancelled orders must be done prior to the cut off time in order for a refund to be processed.
